

# Klondike 2010

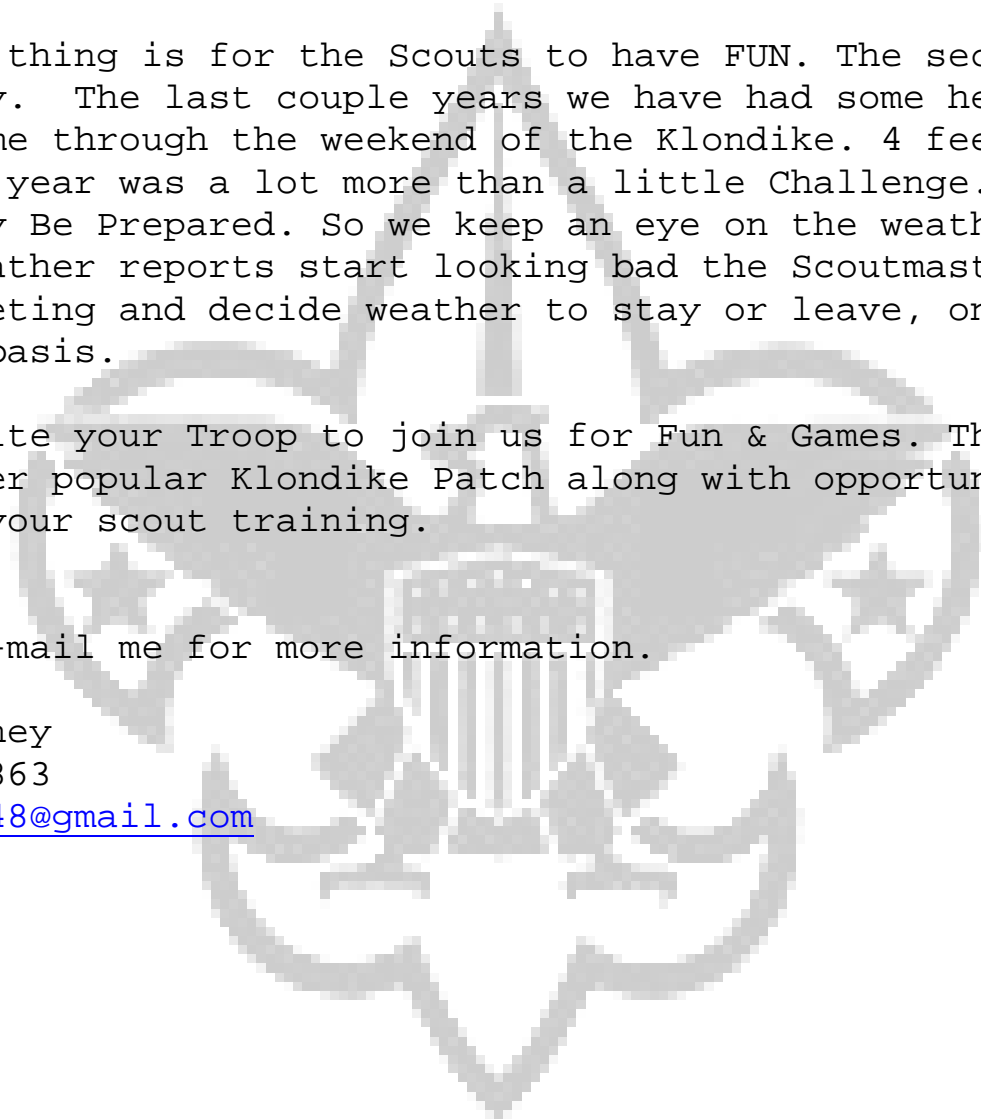
Hi I am Allen Mooney with Troop 148 from Stockton

# KLONDIKE 2010

## KLONDIKE EQUIPMENT LIST FOR EACH PATROL

- 1- Current Troop Medical Forms
- 1- Tour Permit
- 1- Paid Receipt
- 1- Pair of Proper Footwear per Scout Waterproof Snow Boots Only Please
  - No Tennis shoes, leather shoes
- 1- Klondike Sled and Equipment on the sled.
- 1- Sled Identification: Patrol Name, Troop
- 2- Pairs of Snowshoes
- 1- Pencil & Paper per Sled
- 1- Patrol Flag
- 3- Scout Staves – 6 feet long
- 2- Blankets – Wool, Army, and Navy Types are best
  - (Big enough to use as a stretcher)
- 1- Fire Setup, - Kindling, Fuel, Wood & Matches
- 1- Arch Handled Pot with 1 quart marking
- 2- Tarps
- 2- Snow Shovels per Sled
- 1- Bundle of 2 Ft Sticks (Extra Points)
- 1- Patrol First Aid Kit
- 1- Cup or Water Bottle per Scout (No Sharing)
- 1- Helmet per Sled (Bike Helmet ANSI OR SNELL Approved)

## SLED INFORMATION

The sketch below should be used as a guide by teams in designing their sleds. But don't be afraid to use your imagination. Your own design will be accepted if it conforms to the specified dimensions. Just make sure the sled is strong enough to bear the weight of your driver and your equipment.

### Tips:

Use screws instead of nails. Drill first to avoid splitting. Varnish the bottom of the runners, then wax before the race. If you wish, add a canvas snow curtain to keep your equipment dry.

Secure towing bridle firmly so "Huskies" don't get separated from the sled.

### Bill of materials:

- A. 2 pcs. 4" x  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6'6" runners
- B. 4 pcs. 1" x 4" x 18" cross supports
- B-1 1 pc. 1" x 4" x 20" cross support
- C. 4 pcs.  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4" x 5' floor planks
- D. 2 pcs. 1" x 2" x 40" rear uprights
- E. 2 pcs. 1" x 2" x 31" 2nd rear uprights
- F. 2 pcs. 1" x 2" x 22" 2nd front uprights
- G. 2 pcs. 1" x 2" x 13" front uprights
- H. 2 pcs. 1" x 2" x 6' hand rails
- I. 1 pc. 1" x 4" x 16" tow bar
- J. 1 pc. 1" x 2" x 20" handle bar
